Kinlochbervie Community Project Co-ordinator –about the role and the initial draft of the Growth Plan

The project co-ordinator's post is financed by Highlands and Islands Enterprise and Leader until November 2011.

The post is in place to support groups who are actively seeking to contribute to the well being of the community, through providing worthwhile facilities. I report into the Kinlochbervie Community Company.

One of the requirements of the post was to produce a "Growth Plan" for Kinlochbervie which highlighted projects which were of particular interest to the residents. This was based on the recent questionnaires which have been distributed, and illustrates the need for everybody's feedback.

The Growth Plan is an evolving document and is therefore not set in stone. The list of projects is not an exhaustive list of what is taking place in

Kinlochbervie or the surrounding areas at this time, but a reflection of the comments I have received.

The attendance at the meeting in November when my appointment was announced was encouraging but the response to the project list at Christmas was disappointing.

From the replies we did receive, we have selected the preferred projects as voiced by the majority of the responses. We have also focused on projects which will support the Sutherland Wide Plan which was produced by the Sutherland Partnership in June 2010, along with the Highland Wide Local Plan which can be found on the Highland Council website.

My role is for a short period of time and funding is not easily avail-

able due to the current economic climate but I will endeavour to support any group as required. Please utilise this role while you can!
