Draft Minutes of Meeting held on 29 March 2016 at The Harbour Offices

1.0 Minutes of 23 February 2016

The minutes of the meeting held on 23 February 2016 were proposed for approval by Christine and seconded by Murdo. The minutes were approved.

2.0 Matters arising from Minutes of 23 February 2016

2.1 Proposed Health Care Provision Changes

There was no further news.

2.2 17 Manse Road

Margaret and Graham gave an update. As the group has been awarded a 75% grant amounting to £15,000, work can begin once a further £5,000 is raised. The Company is applying for money from the Ward Discretionary Fund and HIE and is hopeful that the work can begin soon. The lease is now with the Company's solicitors for final review.

At a meeting with Highland Councillors, further enquiries were made about the next-door property at 18 Manse Road. Indications are positive that Care and Learning (the owners of the house) will offer it to the Company.

2.3 Geopark

Murdo reported Geopark will be holding an Extraordinary General Meeting next Thursday to consider charitable status.

2.4 Core Paths

Matt Dent has made the signs. The Community Council re-iterated its preference for a change of name for one path: the Sheilings path should be the Manse Road Peat Road path.

2.5 Football Pitch and Play Park

Christine reported that the group has been successful in securing a grant of £10,000; the entire budget is expected to be around £100,000 so it is a start. An application to Sport Scotland for the football pitch is currently being prepared by Alan Jones. This is a much larger project.

Graham also reported that the football team is now receiving coaching from an ex-professional footballer from Scourie.

2.6 Loch Clash Project

Margaret and Graham reported that the work is well underway.

2.7 Benches at Droman

There has been no change since the last meeting. The benches are ready but will need repainting.

2.8 Storm Damage at Loch Clash

Any work will wait for better weather.

2.9 Droman Pier

There was no update on Droman Pier as Hugh Morrison was not able to be at the meeting.

2.10 Community Broadband

Margaret reported that the Stage 1 has been completed. There is a big difference between speeds in the village and those in the outlying communities. The next step is an appraisal of technical options. The staff are also organising a meeting for all North West Sutherland local groups to investigate joining together to develop one project that would serve the whole area.

2.18 Reduction in Highland Council Ranger Service

Highland Council voted to retain the Ranger Service at a reduced level. Seven Rangers applied for voluntary redundancy leaving 13 Rangers in place. It is assumed that the remaining Rangers will fill the gap. In this area, both Donald Mitchell (Sutherland) and Andy Summers (Assynt) have retained their jobs. The Lairg Rangers requested voluntary redundancy.

2.19 Rats in Manse Road

There have been no further reports of rats in Manse Road.

2.20 Access to Oldshoremore Beach

The stairs still need to be stabilised. With the coming of spring, visitor numbers have risen causing the path down to the beach to become even deeper.
